

Laura Mersereau Pressnall was a vibrant young woman who died at age 46 due to physical complications from a quarter-century battle with drugs and alcohol. Her older brother Brad fondly remembers her as a freckle-faced and ginger-haired high school senior with an open smile. After her senior year Laura tried her first hit of LSD. The experiment had terrible consequences: Laura drank and kept drinking until six months before her death in 1999.

In the spirit of Laura, Brad created the Laura Mersereau Award. Brad teamed with Oregon Partnership. Oregon Partnership is a statewide non-profit promoting healthy kids and communities through drug and alcohol awareness, drug prevention programs, and 24 hour crisis lines for treatment referrals and suicide intervention. Oregon Partnership works with schools and community coalitions statewide, and our resource library is open to all to educate on the dangers of substance abuse.
